poststructuralism has long been acknowledged to offer a radical critique of the foundational subject as a precursor to affirming a constituted subject its detractors have however held that the resultant position cannot offer a coherent account of agency strong version or alternatively that while it may be able to account for non subjective agency it is unable to develop a coherent explanation for subjective agency weak version somewhat strangely this issue has been largely ignored by commentators predisposed to poststructuralist thought in contrast this volume focuses on the works of judith butler cornelius castoriadis gilles deleuze jacques derrida michel foucault luce irigaray jacques lacan and catherine malabou to show that the question of the subject is a key one for many poststructuralist thinkers that they are aware of the problematic status of agency that arises from their decentering of the foundational subject and that they offer heterogeneous responses to it subjective agency and poststructuralism will therefore be an invaluable resource for researchers and advanced students interested in philosophy political theory psychoanalysis critical theory history of ideas feminist theory and cultural studies

the aqedah i.e. the story of the binding of isaac by abraham is a core text in all three abrahamic religions and has been widely discussed in judaism christianity and islam for centuries it still represents an intellectual moral and spiritual challenge for anyone who claims to be able to link morality and faith in god in a reasonably comprehensible way the contributions in this anthology address this challenge from philosophical theological and literary perspectives by considering exemplary problems epochs and authors pertaining to all three abrahamic religions the first part contains seven contributions exploring the epistemic and/or philosophical dimensions of the aqedah the second part contains nine essays on the history of the interpretation of the aqedah from israelite jewish christian and islamic perspectives the three texts in the third and final part discuss narratological issues and reflections of the problem within modern hebrew literature the volume complements and expands the existing scholarship on the subject above all through its consistently interreligious approach and the inclusion of current philosophical and literary sources and debates

an insurrectionist manifesto contains four insurrectionary gospels based on martin heidegger s philosophical model of the fourfold earth and sky gods and mortals challenging religious dogma and dominant philosophical theories they offer a cooperative world affirming political theology that promotes new life through not resurrection but insurrection the insurrection in these gospels unfolds as a series of miraculous yet worldly practices of vital affirmation since these routines do not rely on fantasies of escape they engender intimate transformations of the self along the very coordinates from which they emerge enacting a comparative and contagious postsecular sensibility these gospels draw on the work of slavo j i ek giorgio agamben catherine malabou françois laruelle peter sloterdijk and gilles deleuze yet rejuvenate scholarship in continental philosophy critical race theory the new materialisms speculative realism and nonphilosophy they think beyond the sovereign force of the one to initiate a radical politics after god
